## **Enjoy our landscape...**

Winter months are a time of rest for our gardens. Here is a look at plans for our grounds this year.

- Cody Pepper from Chapel Branch Property Land Management is our landscaper and does a monthly check of our property, including trimming and mulching at designated times during the year.
- You may have noticed three new shrubs along the fence in the front yard. Thanks to careful research by Andrika Brown and Naomi Clark-Turner, these plants are a new selection of viburnum that are "heat tolerant" and offer evergreen foliage with white blossoms in the spring as well as blue fruit in summer through fall. They also are resistant to deer and rabbits. They complete a nice grouping of plants along our neighbor's fence line.
- In the backyard we have one hydrangea that is dead and will be removed by Cody in the spring.
- A special thank you goes to our fearless Sweepers who help maintain the walkways throughout the year. To help our sweepers, we have acquired a new cordless blower which is stored in the clubhouse closet. Its battery pack is plugged in next to the fire extinguisher in the kitchen. (Please remember to plug it back in after using the blower!)
